How to Study for True/False Exams

- 1. Remember that everything has to be true if a statement is to be marked true, but that if it is to be marked false only one detail need be false. Read each question carefully, looking for qualifying words that tend to make statements true, such as the following: some, sometimes, usually, most.
- 2. Read each question carefully, looking for words that tend to make statements false. The words listed below don't always make a true-false statement false, but they should alert you to think carefully: All, always, none, no, never, and only
- 3. Mark your answer sheet the way the directions tell you to mark it. Just because it is a true-false test doesn't necessarily mean you use the symbols "T" and "F."
- 4. Find out whether you will lose points if you guess. Some instructors consider wrong only those answers that you actually mark incorrectly, others consider every unanswered question


