Pamela was born in Hobbs in the early sixties. She was fostered by her grand parents Robert and Addie Evans and attended Booker Т Washington Elementary school.

"I don't think any child could have been raised in a more loving home," she said. "My grandparents brought me up in the Church of Christ. Addie, my big momma, was a gifted and devout Christian woman. She taught me what I needed to know, not only to survive, but also to succeed in the world."



Ross moved to Fort Worth, Texas where she graduated cum laude at the age of sixteen from high school. She attended the University of Texas studying Business Arlington Administration before taking a job with Mitsubishi in Los Angeles. There, a chance meeting with singer Stevie Wonder changed the direction of her life.

"I met Stevie at a social event," she remembered. "He owned a radio station and offered me an opportunity to work for him. He said he was intrigued by the sound of my voice. I took a job in his public relations department and eventually became an on air radio personality.

"Working in talk radio was very rewarding," she continued. "Being in the media is to be an eye witness to history. I always considered it was my


