

Oxy to invest in oilfield

■ CO2 injection planned to increase oil production in south Hobbs field

Oxy Permian will soon be dropping as much as half a billion dollars into the Hobbs economy with a planned rework of its south Hobbs field that should extend the field's life by as much as 30 years.

Jeff Simmons, president and general man-

ager of Oxy Permian CO2, discussed how the company's plan will revitalize the south



Hobbs fields and increase oil production in those older fields by more than 100 percent.

"We expect to have our first CO2 injection in South Hobbs around September 2015 and expect to see a substantial increase in daily oil production," Simmons said. "We expect to spend several hundred million in the coming years for the development."
