#### **Senior Pictures**

Seniors, the deadline to submit your senior pictures is Oct 7. Mrs. Seeker needs three wallet-sized pictures. The pictures need to be full-color, head and shoulders only. Your hands may not be in the picture and you must be wearing school appropriate attire with no facial hair or facial piercings.

#### **PSAT**

The PSAT will be given Oct.12 at Hobbs High School. Juniors are strongly encouraged to take the exam. By taking the exam, juniors will be automatically entered in the 2011 National Merit Scholarship Program. The program will honor 50,000 students and offer Merit Scholarship awards to more than 8,000. All sophomores will be taking the PSAT for the experience of taking a college entrance exam but are not be eligible for the National Merit Scholarship competition until their junior year. It is not necessary for the sophomores to sign-up for the PSAT since their entire class will be taking the exam.

However, since additional tests may have to be ordered, any junior interested in taking the PSAT must sign-up in the HHS Guidance office. The cut off date for PSAT registration is Sept. To learn more, visit www.nationalmerit.org. and read the PSAT/NMSQT Student Bulletin.

quently heard, "There is no homework." The point needs to be made that just because no specific homework has been assigned, there is still homework: it's called study time. It is strongly recommended that all students spend a minimum of one half hour of homework/study time (five days a week) on each academic subject pursued. If your son or daughter has no studying to do, in order to complete this 2.5-hour time frame he or she should read a good book.

With school and parents working together, it needs to be stressed to our young people that study, in contrast to specific homework, includes:

- 1. Rewriting classroom lecture notes or lab reports.
- 2. Checking lecture notes while they are still fresh in a student's mind. In terms of understanding material, one hour spent as soon after a lecture a possible is worth several hours a few days later.
- 3. Outlining an English or science chapter to use to review for a quiz or chap-
- 4. Rethinking, for example foreign language vocabulary words by making up English sentences and transcribing them into the foreign language.
- 5. Reviewing, for example, reviewing theorems in geometry so one knows them verbatim and can apply them to problems not previously assigned.
- 6. Getting a good night's sleep before a test – no cramming! Research shows that sleep aids in "sealing in" infor-

### TIPS for making your classes count

- Sit close to the front of the classroom when possible.
- Join in class discussions.
- Ask guestions! If you don't understand something, chances are others in the class don't understand either.
- Keep up with class assignments. Finish them before they're due. ■ Ask for help in any class in which you

find yourself falling behind.


